

## Verses for paper chains

On the following pages you will find the verses to make paper chains at Christmas. Pages 2-3 have the OT prophecies. I would suggest you print this out on green paper. Pages 4-5 have the NT fulfilments of those prophecies. I would suggest you print these on red paper.



All the links in the chain should be the same width. The OT prophecy strips are numbered corresponding to the number on its NT fulfilment strip. Try to match them up before you stick them together. Keeping them in order gives a visual explanation of how the NT shows us the fulfilment of OT prophecies and you can explain that this helps us to understand the continuity and the reliability of Scriptures.

1	<b>“And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel.’ Genesis 3 v 15</b>
2	<b>‘In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. This is the name by which he will be called: The LORD Our Righteousness.’ Jeremiah 23 v 6</b>
3	<b>‘I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you; I will make your name great and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you.’ Genesis 12 v 2-3</b>

5	<b>““I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people... I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more.”” Jeremiah 31 v 33-34</b>
6	<b>‘The sceptre will not depart from Judah, nor the ruler’s staff from between his feet, until he comes to whom it belongs and the obedience of the nations is his.’ Genesis 49 v 10</b>
7	<b>““The days are coming,” declares the LORD, “when I will raise up to David a righteous Branch, a King who will reign wisely and do what is just and right in the land.”” Jeremiah 23 v 5</b>
8	<b>‘The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.’ Isaiah 9 v 2</b>

17	<b>‘This is what the LORD says: “A voice is heard in Ramah, mourning and great weeping, Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted, because her children are no more.”’ Jeremiah 31 v 15</b>
18	<b>‘For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.’ Isaiah 9 v 6</b>

3	<b>'A record of the genealogy of Jesus Christ the son of David, the son of Abraham'</b> Matthew 1 v 1
